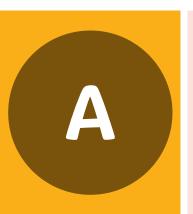
When to Use A, An, or The

Articles in English are modifiers. They are used in front of a noun (person, place, or thing). They are used to let us know if the noun is specific or general.

indefinite



It is used in front of a singular, not specific noun.

It is used in front of nouns that begin with a **consonant** sound.

Examples:

a bear (any bear)

a tree (any tree)



It is used in front of a singular, not specific noun.

It is used in front of nouns that begin with a **vowel** sound.

Examples:

an elephant (any elephant)

an apple (any apple)

It is used in front of singular or plural nouns.

It is used to show the **specificity** of an item or items.

Examples:

the telephone (a specific telephone)

the man (a specific man)
